Dear People of Christ Church,

While I was at the 100 year anniversary celebration of the consecration of our diocesan cathedral (go to shrinemont.org if you wish to watch the service), I had a wonderful conversation with one of our vocational deacons about church life. She mentioned that, upon her arrival at her new parish, she talked to a parishioner about difference the deacon noticed between the different Episcopal churches she had served. The parishioner was genuinely shocked to hear this, saying, "I thought all Episcopal churches were alike." I think that the deacon was shocked that anyone would think that any two Episcopal churches were the same.

While we serve the same Lord, Jesus, and while we have a Book of Common Prayer to guide our worship, beyond that, every Episcopal church is different if only because of different clergy, different parish community members, and different ways for how communities go about their ministries. For anyone who is coming into Christ Church from another church, not even necessarily Episcopal, Christ Church is probably different from what they encountered before.

All of that said, we are fortunate to have several new people around the community who may be wondering what is going on in the parish. At the same time, the parish leaders are also trying to do some of our ministries in ways which are different from a "before" time. It is from that perspective that I point out some information about Christ Church.

Of course, if you are reading this, then you know that we have a monthly newsletter. While everyone has a favorite ministry they focus on with the newsletter, I encourage you to read the entire newsletter which has information from several of the parish ministries and events. Because of improvements in some of our facilities, program locations may have changed. Also, we are planning some new programs through the fall.

We have also worked on providing more information via our website and through our Thursday emails. There is a saying that you need to communicate information through four or five different ways to make sure the information gets out there. Add in Sunday's worship and asking parish leadership, we are trying to keep people up to date.

One example of surprises and unexpected opportunities in the parish community is the announcement I received this past week that we will have a visitation from one of our bishops the last Sunday of April 2026. The visitation includes the celebrations of baptisms, confirmations and receptions in the Episcopal Church. For our dates planning to celebrate baptisms, we will have baptisms on November 2, 2025, January 11, 2026, April 5, 2026, May 31, 2026, and now on April 26, 2026. I will send out more information about confirmation and reception once we get started into the program year.

Stewardship Thoughts

Stewardship in the Episcopal Church is described as "being grateful, responsible stewards of the gifts we receive from God". It is a fundamental principle of Christian faith, encompassing more than just financial giving. It is about how we use all the blessings God has entrusted to us including our time, talents, and resources to serve His mission and build a vibrant and thriving community.

The biblical principle of stewardship reminds us that everything we have is ultimately a gift from God. As Psalm 24:1 states, "The earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, The world and those who dwell therein". We are called to be good managers of these gifts, using them to further God's kingdom and serve those in need.

Holistic Stewardship

From the Vestry

August Vestry Meeting Highlights

- The treasurer reported strong giving from the parish so far this year. The Vestry is grateful for the support and encourages people to keep it up.
- Properties Committee is looking for a date for parish keep day in early November. They have to wait and see when the leaves fall. They also have a new HVAC maintenance contract with Riddleburger for the care and upkeep of the church systems.
- The Senior Warden, Barbara Downs, reported on the update of the Vestry Committee Charters. The Vestry began the charter process to be sure committee members, both new and old, understood what the committees are intended to do. These charters provide committees with their vision and mission statements, guidelines for spending, staff support and basic committee structures. The Vestry and Committees review their charters each year to make sure the charters are effective and up-to-date.
- With the announcement of Bonnie Blue Restaurant as a new neighbor, the Rector reported that he and the Senior Warden are working with the city and all parties involved to address concerns with pedestrian safety and parking issues around the church. While much of the conversation is preliminary at this point, the Vestry will continue to keep the parish updated with what is learned.

From the Altar Guild

Altar Flowers at Christ Church

Each Sunday during the church year (except during Lent), two fresh flower arrangements adorn the altar, bringing beauty and joy to our worship space. These flowers are donated by parishioners—often in memory of a loved one or in celebration of a special person or occasion.

Parishioner Polly Nesselrodt coordinates the flower schedule. Many families choose the same Sunday each year for their donation, and when a date becomes available, Polly reaches out to those who have expressed interest.

When donating, families contact the florist directly to order and pay for the arrangements, following Altar Guild guidelines. The cost is usually around \$75 per arrangement, depending on the florist and flowers selected. Commonly used florists include Winchester Floral, Snellings, and Blue Bells. (Please note: artificial or silk flowers are not permitted.) Polly provides all necessary details well in advance.

Donors also share how they would like their dedication worded for the bulletin and Prayers of the People. After the service, arrangements may be taken home—or, if preferred, they can be delivered by another parishioner to someone who could use the blessing of fresh flowers.
